2023 STUDENT AWARD RECIPIENTS

In 2023, there were two recipients for the **Student Research Award (SRA)**. The two worthy recipients of these awards were: Helen Wu and Srividya Bhagavan.



Helen Wu SRA Recipient

Helen Wu is a graduate of the Master's in Occupational and Environmental Hygiene (OEH) Program at the University of British Columbia, and has a background specializing in pharmacology from the University of Alberta. Helen is a recipient of WorkSafeBCs Research Training Award for ototoxicity, and the Board Certified Profession Scholarship and the American Industrial Hygiene Association (AIHA) Scholarship. Helen is the principal investigator of the ototoxicant, jet fuel, for a large-scale systematic review of the International Ototoxicity Management Group (IOMG) and works closely with the world-renowned experts in ototoxicity from the National Institute of Safety and Health (NIOSH).



Srividya Bhagavan SRA Recipient

Srividya Grama Bhagavan joined the Ph.D. program at Iowa in fall 2021. She completed her Bachelor's degree in Speech Language Pathology and Audiology in 2016 from Bangalore University, and a Master's degree in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology in 2019 from Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Mangalore, India. Prior to joining the Ph.D. program, she worked as an Audiologist and Speech-Language Pathologist in renowned hospitals and private clinics in India, where she authored three international publications. Apart from academics, Srividya likes to listen to music, read, travel and hike.

Conner Jansen SCA Recipient

Connor is a doctoral student at The University of Texas at Dallas, in the dual AuD/PhD program there. His undergraduate degree was in Communication Sciences and Disorders which he also completed at UT Austin, with a specialization in Audiology, and minor in American Sign Language prior to joining the team at UT-Dallas. His research interests include hearing conservation/hearing protection device habits & beliefs, vestibular disorders and diagnostics. hearing loss. He also did some work in musician HPDs, and sub-clinical hearing loss.



Xin Zhang SCA Recipient

Xin is a first year PhD student at the University of Michigan, Department of Environmental Health Sciences. She also holds a master's degree in Industrial Hygiene, and is certified as an Occupational Hearing Conservationist. Her areas of interest include occupational noise exposure and related physical and psychological health outcomes. Her doctoral research pursuits will focus on applying machine learning algorithms and time series analysis to explore the effect of noise exposure on hearing and cardiovascular systems collected by wearable sensors.



Sollen Ollivier SCA Recipient

Solenn has both an engineering degree from France, and a Master of Science degree in Biomedical Engineering from Columbia University. Currently, Solenn is pursuing a PhD focusing on the development of a protective hearing aid for workers in noisy environments via a collaborative research project with the University of Ottawa, University of Laval and IRSST, the Quebec Occupational Health and Safety Research Institute. The research focuses specifically on combining hearing aid, hearing protection and continuous monitoring of an individual's noise exposure into a single intra-aural device.



Sean Hoverson SCA Recipient

Sean is currently a 4th year AuD student attending the University of Northern Colorado, and completing a one year audiology externship with the VA at Puget Sound Health Care System in Washington state. Both his clinical and research interests include the prevention of noise-induced hearing loss, tinnitus, and adult aural rehabilitation. Sean is a certified CAOHC Occupational Hearing Conservationist. His doctoral scholarly project is entitled "Spectator Noise Exposure During a Season of Minor League Hockey."


The Foundation congratulates all award recipients on being chosen and hopes they will be frequent attendees at our annual conferences.

NEW STUDENT AWARD


In 2022, the Board unanimously voted to start finalizing what will be called the Student Tuition Award (STA). Initially, the STA will be \$5,000.00 awarded to at least one student each year. In time, we anticipate that two awards per year will be implemented. The application process, including eligibility criteria, and selection committee criteria is hoped to be finalized in 2023. We will be reaching out to members in academia to help us finalize the criteria for this award.

2023 FUNDRAISING

Based on our executive management firm's legal counsel strongly recommending that we do not conduct the 50/50 split, the Board decided to suspend this activity indefinitely. Because our conference spans the nation, the Foundation would have to purchase gaming licenses from numerous states. The time and cost to do this would be counter productive. However, the Foundation will continue to accept monetary donations outright. To enhance the spirit of donating for this past conference, the Foundation had a drawing of a cochlea on an easel stand in the exhibit hall, and members were encouraged to add "hair cells" to the cochlea. For each \$20.00 donation, 5 stickers representing a hair cell was applied to the cochlea. Hair cells could also be purchased individually as well. More interesting, William (Bill) Murphy's head shot was also on an easel, and members were encouraged to add "hair" to Bill's head as well. This activity was overwhelmingly successful, and the Foundation received \$3,110. We thank members for participating in this "hair raising" event!
